



But when tragedy strikes, Imogen is left widowed, and finds herself moving into Storybook Cottage alone with only her monstrously narcissistic cat for company. After discovering she is pregnant, Imogen grows determined to embrace a new start in Middlemass, with its duckpond, cricket matches and village fêtes. The only thing Imogen can't seem to shake is her neighbor- a brooding, artisan blacksmith named Zach- who she can't quite decide is friend or foe. That is until she realizes, thanks to an arcane clause in her deeds, that Zach is not just an artist, but Lord of the local manor house. He has the power to take her home and leave her completely broke. Devastatingly - he seems keen to do exactly that. Yet, Imogen finds herself drawn to him nonetheless. And in her darkest hour, Zach may just be the bright spot to save Imogen in more ways than one.

Poppy Alexander wrote her first book when she was five. There was a long gap in her writing career while she was at school, and after studying classical music at university, she decided the world of music was better off without her and took up public relations, campaigning, political lobbying, and a bit of journalism instead. She takes an anthropological interest in family, friends, and life in her West Sussex village (think *The Archers* crossed with *Twin Peaks*), where she lives with her husband, children, and various other pets.



Set in a Lower East Side tenement in the early days of the COVID-19 lockdowns, Fourteen Days is an irresistibly propulsive collaborative novel from the Authors Guild, with an unusual twist: each character in this diverse, eccentric cast of New York neighbors has been secretly written by a different, major literary voice—from Margaret Atwood and Celeste Ng to Tommy Orange and John Grisham.

One week into the COVID-19 shutdown, tenants of a Lower East Side apartment building in Manhattan have begun to gather on the rooftop and tell stories. Margaret Atwood, general editor, is the author of more than fifty books of fiction, poetry, critical essays and graphic novels. Her latest novel was 2019's The Testaments, a co-winner of that year's Booker Prize and a sequel to The Handmaid's Tale.

Douglas Preston has published 39 books of fiction and nonfiction, of which 32 have been New York Times bestsellers, some reaching the #1 position. Two of his novels, co-written with Lincoln Child, were chosen in a National Public Radio poll of readers as being among the 100 greatest thrillers ever written. His recent nonfiction book, The Lost City of the Monkey God, was named a notable book of the year by the New York Times, the Boston Globe, and National Geographic magazine. In addition to books, Preston writes about archaeology and paleontology for the New Yorker Magazine. He worked as an editor for the American Museum of Natural History in New York and taught nonfiction writing at Princeton University. He is the recipient of numerous writing awards in the U.S. and Europe, and he served as president of the Authors Guild from 2019 to 2023.

But his heart is black as ice. To seize Casa Florio, he abandoned the love of his life—an act of treachery which still casts a dark shadow.

Barely twenty, his son Ignazziddu stands to inherit all that his father has built. Yet he is nothing like Ignatius. A nervous young man, he does not want to be shackled to his infamous name, to sacrifice himself for the family. Despite his fears, he embraces Vincenzo's legacy, and must face a world that changes too quickly, agitated by new, violent, and uncontrollable forces. Ignazziddu eventually realizes that it's not enough to have Florio blood to become the imposing force his grandfather and father were. What is it they had that he lacks?

Beside father and son are two extraordinary women: Giovanna, Vincenzo's wife, hard and fragile as crystal, full of passion but hungry for love, and Franca, the wife of Ignazziddu, the most beautiful woman in Europe, whose golden existence is threatened by the blows of a cruel fate. It is these women who unforgettably animate *The Triumph of the Lions*.

Bringing the Belle Epoque into stunning relief, Auci dives deeper into the exhilarating and terrible, glorious and tragic history of a family that, for decades, sat high above Italian society, and made the heart of an island and city beat.



In 1924, Cecily Larson's mother reluctantly drops her off at an orphanage in Chicago, promising to be back within the year once she's made enough money to support both Cecily and herself. This discovery brings the tragic love story that she's kept hidden for decades back into her life and throws into question everything about the family she's raised and claimed as her own for nearly seventy years. Cecily and everyone in her life must now decide who they really are and what family, and forgiveness, really mean.

Sweeping through a long period of contemporary history, *The Hidden Life of Cecily Larson* is an immersive, compelling, and entertaining family drama centered around one remarkable woman and her determination to survive.





Twenty-one-year-old Hardy "Hardly" Reed—good-natured, easygoing, usually stoned—is drifting through life. A minimumwage scare actor at an amusement park, he avoids unnecessary effort and unrealistic ambitions. Then one day he notices two children, around six or seven, sitting all alone on a bench. Hardly checks if they're okay and sees injuries on both children. Someone is hurting these kids. He reports the incident to Child Protective Service. That should be the end of it. After all, Hardly's not even good at looking out for himself so the last thing he wants to do is look out for anyone else. But he's haunted by the two kids, his heart breaking for them. And the more research he does the less he trusts that Child Protective Services —understaffed and overworked—will do anything about it. That leaves...Hardly. He is probably the last person you'd ever want to count on. But those two kids have nobody else but him. Hardly has to do what's right and help them. For the first time in his life, Hardly decides to fight for something. This might be the one point in his entire life, he realizes, that is the entire point of his life. He will help those kids. At first, trying to gather evidence that will force the proper authorities to intervene, Hardly is a total disaster. Gradually, with assistance from unexpected allies, he develops investigative skills and discovers he's smarter and more capable than he ever imagined. But Hardly also discovers that the situation is more dangerous than he ever expected. The abusive father who has been hurting these children isn't just a lawyer—he also runs a violent drugdealing operation. The mother claims she wants to escape with the kids—but Hardly isn't sure he can trust her. Faced with a different version of himself than he has ever known, Hardly refuses to give up. But his commitment to saving these kids from further harm might end up getting the kids, and Hardly himself, killed.







Jennifer Chiaverini's beloved and bestselling Elm Creek Quilts series returns with the first Elm Creek novel since 2019's The Christmas Boutique.

In June 2004, founding Elm Creek Quilter Summer Sullivan unexpectedly returns to Elm Creek Manor from the University of Chicago, where she has spent nearly two years pursuing her master's degree in history. The Elm Creek Quilters are delighted to see her, but Summer's sudden homecoming concerns them too. She's visibly weary and dejected, evading questions about why she returned and how long she plans to stay.

Fellow founding member Agnes Emberly—a sunny, optimistic septuagenarian—proposes something to keep Summer busy, an important assignment that requires not only a historian's research skills, but also a thorough understanding of the art and traditions of quilting. As a member of the executive board of the Waterford Historical Society, Agnes has played an important role in the ongoing restoration of Union Hall, the once stately, now neglected Greek Revival edifice that had been slated for demolition until volunteers discovered two exquisite antique quilts in an old trunk that proved Union Hall's ties to the region's storied past, including prominent local abolitionists, suffragists, writers, and Underground Railroad conductors. Now, they must organize a fundraiser to preserve the old building: a quilt exhibit presenting the community's historic quilts.

Summer eagerly accepts the job. She uncovers astonishing, sometimes scandalous facts about Waterford's past which prompt unsettling questions about racism, economic injustice, and political corruption within their community, past and present. Curious, Summer pursues every lead, recording the troubling answers in the object labels on the gallery walls.

As word of the exhibit spreads, quilt lovers and history buffs travel from hundreds of miles around to view the growing collection. But not all visitors have good intentions. Some demand that she revise the object labels to remove all details they deem offensive. As word spreads throughout the Elm Creek Valley and beyond, Summer finds herself torn between her determination to uncover her hometown's often troubled past, and concern that her pursuit of the truth might cost the Waterford Historical Society their last chance to save Union Hall. Yet Summer is ever mindful that the collective memories that have been deliberately lost are often those most in need of unflinching scrutiny.

With every precious quilt she discovers and displays, Summer finds her passion for history renewed. In studying the past, she has glimpsed a promising new future for herself.

For her own salvation, the young girl begins to think of her personal hell as her "first love paradise," where the power of love, no matter how twisted, gives her the strength to survive.

One of the biggest books to come out of Taiwan in the last decade, Fang Si-Chi's First Love Paradise is a chilling tale of grooming and its lingering trauma, and the power structures that allow it to flourish. Insightful, unsettling, emotionally raw, it is a staggering work of literature that reverberates across cultures and forces us to confront painful truths about the vulnerability and strength of women and those who use and hurt them.

Fun, fastpaced, and effortlessly enchanting, Park Seolyeon's sentences sparkle courtesy of awardnominated translator Anton Hur's glittering translation. The novella reimagines classic genre tropes against the backdrop of real-world challenges: how we wrestle with our perceived insignificance and our vital place in a universe that feels like it could end at any given moment. She's been trying to bring more racial diversity to her daughters' school for years, and what could be better than a brand-new Black family? Rebecca can't wait to meet the Whitmans, especially De'Andrea, and serendipity strikes when Nina and Isabella become besties on the first day of kindergarten. Finally, Rebecca has the chance to put everything she's learned about antiracism into practice—especially those oh-so-informative social media posts. Finally, the Parent Diversity Committee she chairs will have some... well, diversity. Honoring the promise to her therapist to get more involved in her new community, De'Andrea reluctantly joins the Parent Diversity Committee. Rebecca is so overly eager, De'Andrea can't help but wonder if she's been tasked by her therapist to make a Black friend! She isn't impressed by Rebecca whose attempts at allyship come off as annoying, and she could care less about the Parent Diversity Committee's mission to bring down the town's historic one-armed confederate statue. But when confronting Rolling Hill's rising racial sentiments becomes the women's common cause, they'll find that isn't the only thing they have in common... Tackling performative allyship, sisterhood, and racial reconciliation with humor and grace, REBECCA, NOT BECKY is hilarious, heartfelt, and impossible to put down.

Diane Richards' Ella Fitzgerald is inspiring and intriguing—an emotionally rich, psychologically complex character, a flawed mother and wife who struggles with deep emotional scars and trauma and battles racism, sexism, and colorism as she learns to find her voice on the stage. Ella takes us from the brothels, speakeasys, and streets of Depression-era New York City to the grand hotel suites where Ella, now older and wiser, looks back on her life and finally confronts the demons from childhood that torment her.

Compelling and rich in historical detail, *Ella* is a remarkable debut novel about an extraordinary woman.



No Better Time

A Novel of the Spirited Women of the 6888 Central Postal Directory Battalion

By Sheila Williams

Sheila Williams returns with an engrossing novel about the 6888, the only all-Black, all-female battalion to serve overseas during World War II

Growing up, author Sheila Williams was always intrigued by her cousin Dorothy Turner Johnson, who would regale her niece about her time in Europe during World War II serving her country as a member of the WACS (Women Army Corp.) Now, in No Better Time, Williams pays homage to her dear relative and her all-Black, all-women colleagues in a fictionalized account of the 6888th Central Postal Directory Battalion, the only unit of African American women stationed in Europe during World War II. The mission was to process over 17 million packages and mail collected from 1942 through winter, 1944 after the Battle of the Bulge, and stockpiled in airplane hangars across England and France. In Williams' re-telling Johnson is now Dorothy Thom, a Spelman graduate (English literature and French) and college librarian who, after the attack on Pearl Harbor in December, 1941, wants to "do her part", along with women from all levels of society, from sharecroppers to secretaries. Longing for adventure, Dorothy is mesmerized by the words of Army recruiter Captain Dovey Johnson and has only one question: "Will I get to go abroad?" Once there, she's in for many culture shocks. For the African American WACs, navigating a military complex that is segregated by race and gender presents unique challenges. In boot camp, the "colored girls" are asked to step to one side for processing. At the massive Ft. Riley military hospital complex, the women's quarters are situated in primitive wooden structures heated by coal-burning pot-bellied stoves while German POWs reside in refurbished buildings that have central heat and hot water. She and her sister WACs experience kindness and acceptance from the English but not from American GI's also stationed in Birmingham in England. Dorothy and her 6888 WAC sisters are forever changed by their experience in the military and in Europe. They see a wider and more accepting world and are not prepared to go back either in their personal lives or on a broader stage. Using the GI Bill, Dorothy completes graduate school and, like many of the other women, creates a foundation for a life that is broader, richer and more amazing than her ancestors could ever have dreamed of. And it all began with a mission to make sure that the morale of American soldiers was lifted when they received mail from home. No Better Time is both a love letter to the 6888 and the often unacknowledged patriotism that has always existed within Black communities.

Sheila Williams is the author of Things Past Telling, The Secret Women, Dancing on the Edge of the Roof, On the Right Side of a Dream, The Shade of My Own Tree, and Girls Most Likely. She is a contributor to the anthology A Letter for My Mother, selected and edited by Nina Foxx. She has been commissioned as the librettist for Fierce, an original opera composed by William Menefield for the Cincinnati Opera's 100th season in 2020 and performed in 2022. She lives in Northern Kentucky.

Dinner on Monster Island

In this unusual, engaging, and intimate collection of personal essays, Lambda Literary Award finalist Tania De Rozario recalls growing up as a queer, brown, fat girl in Singapore, blending memoir with elements of history, pop culture, horror films, and current events to explore the nature of monsters and what it means to be different.

Tania De Rozario was just twelve years old when she was gay-exorcised. Convinced that her boyish style and demeanor were a sign of something wicked, her mother and a pair of her church friends tried to "banish the evil" from Tania. That day, the young girl realized that monsters weren't just found in horror tales. They could lurk anywhere—including your own family and community—and look just like you.

Dinner on Monster Island is Tania's memoir of her life and childhood in Singapore—where she discovered how difference is often perceived as deviant, damaged, disobedient, and sometimes, demonic. As she pulls back the veil on life on the small island, she reveals the sometimes kind, sometimes monstrous side of all of us. Intertwined with her experiences is an analysis of the role of women in horror. Tania looks at films and popular culture such as Carrie, The Witch, and The Ring to illuminate the ways in which women are often portrayed as monsters, and how in real life, monsters are not what we think.

Moving and lyrical, written with earnest candor, and leavened with moments of humor and optimism, *Dinner on Monster Island* is a deeply personal examination of one woman's experience grappling with her identity and a fantastic analysis of monsters, monstrous women and the worlds in which they live.

Tania De Rozario is a writer and visual artist. She is the author of *Tender Delirium: Poems*, which was shortlisted for the 2014 Singapore Literature Prize, and *And The Walls Come Crumbling Down*, which was a 2021 Lambda Literary Award finalist. She was the winner of the 2020 New Ohio Review Nonfiction Contest, the 2021 Muriel Craft Bailey Memorial Poetry Contest and Singapore's 2011 Golden Point Award for English Poetry. She currently is an adjunct at the University of British Columbia's School of Creative Writing, where she attained her MFA. Born in Singapore, she currently lives and works on the traditional unceded territories of the Musqueam, Squamish, and Tsleil-Waututh First Nations, colonially known as Vancouver.

The Life and Line of Keith Haring

In the 1980's, the subways of New York City were littered with art. Black boards covered outdated advertisements, and chalk drawings covered those boards. These chalk drawings numbered in the hundreds and became synonymous with a city diverse as it was at war with itself, ravaged by poverty and oppression but alive with art and creative energy. And every single one of these drawings was done by Keith Haring. Keith Haring was one of the most emblematic artists of the 1980s, a figure described by his contemporaries as "a prophet in his life, his person, and his work". Part of a cultural crowd that included Andy Warhol, Madonna and Basquiat, he broke down the barriers between high art and popular culture, making his work accessible for all and using it as a means to provoke and inspire radical social change. Haring died of AIDS in 1990. Today his influence and power remain huge in our culture, and his glamorous, tragically short life has a unique aura of mystery and power. Brad Gooch was approached by the Haring Estate and granted access to Haring's extensive archive. He has written a biography that will become the authoritative work on the artist. Based on interviews with those who knew Haring best, drawing from the rich archival history, Brad Gooch sets out to capture the magic of Keith Haring: a visionary and a cult hero.

Brad Gooch is the author of the acclaimed biographies *Rumi's Secret, City Poet* and *Flannery:* A *Life of Flannery O'Connor,* as well as other nonfiction, a memoir, and three novels. The recipient of the National Endowment for the Humanities and Guggenheim fellowships, he earned his PhD at Columbia University and is a professor of English at William Paterson University in New Jersey.



Joe Kent is Shannon Kent's husband and father of their two children. He has served in various positions within U.S. Army Rangers, the Green Berets, and special forces. Marty Skovlund, Jr. has served as an Army Ranger. He sits on the board of advisors for The Darby Project (501c3), an organization that helps Ranger veterans in their transition from military service to civilian life. A filmmaker and writer, he currently serves as the executive editor of Black Rifle Coffee Company's Coffee or Die Magazine, which reaches millions of people per month, catering to the military, veterans, and first responders.





Birding to Change the World

A Memoir By Trish O'Kane

In this uplifting memoir, a professor and activist shares what birds can teach us about life, social change, and protecting the environment.

Trish O'Kane never expected to be a birder. She was a world-traveled journalist with no science background who surprised herself in her forties by falling in love with birds. Cut to seventeen years later, and O'Kane is a highly qualified ornithologist who teaches at the University of Vermont and is the creator of the hugely popular course Birding to Change the World, on which this book is based.

It was a lone red cardinal and a bumptious cast of house sparrows that changed everything for O'Kane after Hurricane Katrina shattered her life in New Orleans. Watching birds thrive throughout the devastated city became her salvation—making her laugh, helping her deal with the trauma, and setting her on a whole new path. Soon O'Kane found herself pursuing a natural sciences PhD in Wisconsin, where she became a full-on bird obsessive—logging hours and hours in a stunningly diverse urban park, binoculars glued to her eyes, filling field notebooks with observations of bird doings and dramas, and volunteering in a bird nursery at a wildlife rehabilitation center.

But it wasn't until that park, her bird-watching haven, was threatened with development that O'Kane became an environmental activist—taking her cues from the birds. She began to adapt for human use birds' strategies for defending their nests and offspring. Like the birds, she and her fellow human park lovers harnessed the power of raised voices and collective action to save the park.

Each chapter in *Birding to Change the World* features at least one species of bird that O'Kane has learned from. She recounts the astonishing science of bird life, including migration and survival strategies, along with many moving and compelling stories about birds and the humans who are fascinated by them. Over the course of this heartfelt memoir, O'Kane shows what birds can teach us—and how that education can be a transformative force for social change.

TRISH O'KANE is an environmental educator who uses action-research to promote environmental and social justice. Now a senior lecturer at the University of Vermont, she created the Birding to Change the World course and program at the University of Wisconsin-Madison while completing her doctorate. Before studying the natural sciences, O'Kane worked as a human and civil rights investigative journalist for a decade in Central America and five years in the Deep South. She has written for major media, including Time, the San Francisco Chronicle, the Christian Science Monitor, and the New York Times. She lives, birds, writes, and gardens in Burlington, Vermont, along with her husband and their dog.

American Girl, American Dreams

My Life with Tom Petty
By Jane Petty and Pamela Des Barres

For the first time, music legend Tom Petty's spouse and muse of 25 years opens up about their intimate, shared lives in this memoir filled with hilarious anecdotes, bittersweet reminiscing, and a healthy dose of sex, drugs, and rock and roll.

Inseparable from their first kiss playing Spin the Bottle, Tom and Jane Petty were rock and roll monarchs cruising around the country on wild band tours and spreading their musical magic. But before heading to Hollywood, or "Hollyweird" as Jane refers to it, she and Tom were just two lost and confused teenagers from Gainesville, Florida whose lives were completely intertwined.

At the age of 13, Jane's younger sister Robin was killed by a car while in her care, and Jane's world shattered. Her mother threw herself into the church, leaving Jane to struggle with her grief and guilt. Meanwhile, a few doors down, Tom was suffering abuse at the hands of his alcoholic father and indomitable mother. As a result, Jane and Tom found peace and solace in their steamy teenage romance. Jane's abrupt loss of childhood had turned her into a caretaker and protector for Tom, and she'd continue to inspire and challenge him through their decades together. Many of Tom's greatest hits, including "Here Comes My Girl," "Listen To Her Heart," and, of course, "American Girl" were written for Jane. At times with Tom on the road, at others holding down the fort while raising their two daughters, Jane had Tom's back through their shared drug abuse, bankruptcy, a devastating house fire (which inspired the hit "I Won't Back Down"), until her battle with depression and his disappearance into hard drugs split them up after 25 years of marriage.





For decades, Joni Mitchell's life and music have enraptured listeners. One of the most celebrated artists of her generation, Mitchell has inspired countless musicians—from peers like James Taylor, to inheritors like Prince and Brandi Carlile—and authors, who have dissected her music and her life in their writing. At the same time, Mitchell has always been a force beckoning us still closer, as—with the other arm—she pushes us away. Given this, music critic Ann Powers wondered if there was another way to draw insights from the life of this singular musician who never stops moving, never stops experimenting. In *Traveling*, Powers seeks to understand Mitchell through her myriad journeys. Through extensive interviews with Mitchell's peers and deep archival research, she takes readers to rural Canada, mapping the singer's childhood battle with polio. She charts the course of Mitchell's musical evolution, ranging from early folk to jazz fusion to experimentation with pop synthetics. She follows the winding road of Mitchell's collaborations with other greats, and the loves that emerged along the way, all the way through to the remarkable return of Mitchell to music-making after the 2015 aneurysm that nearly took her life. Along this journey, Powers' wide-ranging musings on the artist's life and career reconsider the biographer's role and the way it twines against the reality of a fan. In doing so, *Traveling* illustrates the shifting nature of biography, and the ultimate contradiction of celebrity: that an icon cannot truly, completely be known to a fan. Kaleidoscopic in scope, and intimate in its detail, *Traveling* is a fresh and fascinating addition to the Joni Mitchell canon, written by a biographer in full command of her gifts who asks as much of herself as of her subject.

Ann Powers is NPR's music critic and correspondent. In the decade she has worked with NPR, she has written extensively on music and culture, appeared regularly on the All Songs Considered podcast, and news shows including All Things Considered and Morning Edition. Her books include a memoir, Weird Like Us: My Bohemian America, Good Booty: Love and Sex, Black and White, Body and Soul in American Music and Piece by Piece with Tori Amos. She lives in Nashville.


Bob Ross graced TV screens for a decade, with his signature hairdo, button-down shirt, and gentle smile, preached a message of optimism and love as he taught his audience The Joy of Painting. How he became that person is one of the unlikeliest journies in TV history. In this definitive biography of Bob Ross, based on in-depth research and interviews with those closest to him, including his son Steve, Alston Ramsay reveals a complicated man. Bob loved art and nature as a young boy, but because of his temper and habit of getting into trouble, he wound up in the military, where he served for 20 years, many of them in Alaska. There, he was inspired by the sky, mountains, and Northern Lights, and he was driven to pursue his true, unrealized passion: art. Bob found work under the tutelage of Bill Alexander, who pioneered the quick-draw painting technique, and saw that you could actually make a living as an artist with the kind of approach that made it accessible to the general public. Bob became a savvy businessman and adopted some of his mentor's ideas and approaches as his own. He created his own business, became one of Bill's top competitors, and landed a show on PBS. As he took on the TV persona, Bob found that maybe the man who climbed to the top in the eccentric world of guick-draw artists was not the man he wanted to be. Despite a complicated personal life (he was married three times), betrayals, and lawsuits, he resolved to become the gracious, kind, caring man by the time he died of lymphoma at 52 years of age. More than a well-researched and compelling celebrity biography, the narrative attempts to capture Bob's message: that through self-love, forgiveness, and perseverance, you can become the person you want to be.

Alston Ramsay is a journalist, screenwriter, and producer. He previously worked as a speechwriter under the Bush and Obama administrations. Alston is also the showrunner and screenwriter behind the 2018 movie *Midnighters* and the 2020 film *The Current Occupant*, a Hulu production.

Since releasing his first Country album in 2008, Rucker has earned a whole new legion of fans with four No. 1 albums on the Billboard Country chart. What does it say about our culture, and our changing sense of war and history, that this is so?

DAVID THOMSON is the author of more than twenty-five books, including *The Biographical Dictionary of Film*, biographies of Orson Welles and David O. Selznick, and the pioneering novel Suspects, which was peopled with characters from film.

Powerless

By Gabe Gutierrez

NBC News reporter Gabe Gutierrez offers a forceful, necessary exposé on the precarious realities and politics of modern Puerto Rico, detailing the decade of financial exploitation, federal negligence, and American ambivalence that pushed the most populous US territory to the brink and examining what must be done to insure the island's survival.

On September 16, 2017, Hurricane Maria slammed into Puerto Rico as a Category 4 storm, leaving the island devastated and largely without power for weeks. Slow to respond to the severity of the storm and the logistics of the island's geographic isolation, the Trump administration faced harsh criticism for its lack of preparedness. While Maria exposed the federal government's ineptitude and inability to aid Puerto Rico in its time of greatest need, the storm also laid bare a crisis decades in the making, a slow motion trainwreck of American neglect, institutional exploitation, and financial ruin. Now veteran NBC News reporter Gabe Gutierrez, who has covered the island's storms and its people for years, tells the urgent story of how Puerto Rico came to this precarious moment in its history, uncovering how decades of failed US policies have culminated in the tumultuous last ten years. Whether it's the US hedge funds who leveraged the island into bankruptcy, or the federal bureaucracy that has robbed the island of the autonomy to shape its own destiny, the mismanagement of Puerto Rico has stretched across presidential administrations and political parties. As Powerless reveals, with each passing year, with each storm, this negligence comes at a steeper price to US taxpayers, but more importantly to those who live there. With moving portraits of the people working to preserve Puerto Rico for future generations, Gutierrez demonstrates the human cost that accompanies lack of representation in Washington and toll it takes on everyday Puerto Ricans as they fight to keep their vibrant island home. Unable to change their fortunes—despite millions of mainland Americans claiming Puerto Rican heritage—Puerto Ricans remain in limbo, unless the island permanently changes its identity through either statehood or independence. What emerges is an eye-opening narrative of American ambivalence about an island so deeply tied to our uncomfortable, imperial past. Capturing the outrage, heartbreak, and hope that define life on the island, Powerless is seasoned journalist's ambitious examination of what it takes to change American institutions, showing how our failure to care adequately for Puerto Rico is a failure to reckon with our own history.

Gabe Gutierrez is an NBC News National Correspondent, focusing primarily on domestic breaking news and reports for all of the network's platforms, including TODAY, NBC Nightly News with Lester Holt, MSNBC, CNBC, and Telemundo. In that capacity he has covered many of the biggest stories from the last ten years. During the 2016 presidential campaign, he joined NBC's political team covering the Republican primaries, a roll which he is reprising again for 2024. In 2017, he reported from Charlottesville, Virginia, after a deadly white nationalist rally. Then, he covered back-to-back hurricanes: Harvey in Texas; Irma in Florida; and Maria in Puerto Rico. In 2020 and 2021, he reported extensively on the coronavirus pandemic, filing reports in hospital ICUs from New York to Washington State. He was also the network's lead correspondent on the death of George Floyd in Minneapolis. He lives in New York City.



They Came for the Schools

Hixenbaugh's work at newspapers in Ohio, North Carolina, Virginia, and Texas has uncovered deadly failures in the U.S. military, abuses in the child welfare system, and safety lapses at major hospitals. He lives in Houston with his wife and four children.





So begins the story of Sam Hogan and his colorful band of tanker heroes of the Third Armored Division—the "Spearhead"—as they battle on the front lines of some of the war's toughest fights, from Normandy to the Elbe to the Battle of the Bulge. The soldiers of Task Force Hogan come from all walks of life. There are cooks, tankers, infantrymen, salty old sergeants, and wet-behind-the-ears lieutenants. In common, they have a sense of duty to each other and their country, and the struggle against the most sinister enemy modern history has ever produced.

In Task Force Hogan, the story of Sam and his band of heroes comes to life through the writing of his son, Will Hogan—aided by never-before-seen letters, military dispatches, journal entries, and interviews with surviving family of the Task Force. These were the soldiers at the tip of the spear, brave enough to lead the charge and fight against insurmountable odds, and often paying the ultimate price, while liberating French villages and concentration camps as they rolled towards Germany to ultimately win the war. In the pages of this book, Will Hogan finally gives these unsung soldiers the voice and memorial that they all deserve.

William R. Hogan is a fourth-generation US Army officer with a deep and personal interest in World War II history. He is the youngest son of Samuel M. Hogan, one of the Third Armored Division's most colorful and successful combat commanders in the European Theater. 



The Horrifying Twelve Days of the Border Patrol Serial Killer

In this fast-paced, electrifying tic-toc, Pulitzer Prize-winning USA Today journalist Rick Jervis tells the gripping story of the murders and the quest to unmask a cold, calculated killer who was hiding in plain sight. Devil Behind the Badge is also an examination of the lives lost in the killing spree and an attempt to uncover what motivated Ortiz' descent into darkness. The next year, millennials like Colette Shade watched 9/11 on live television in her eighth-grade civics class, and then two years after that the United States invade Iraq based on a lie. The curtain finally came down on Y2k in 2008 when the housing market collapsed, triggering the greatest financial crisis since the Great Depression. It's no wonder nostalgia for Y2k is at an all-time high—when everything feels bleak, we turn to the last time things felt good. This is the subject of Y2K, essayist Colette Shade's darkly funny meditation on the pop culture and political economy of the period. By zooming in on Y2k cultural artifacts like celebrity tabloids, SUVs, and Starbucks, TRL, and the rise of internet porn, Shade produces a searing critique of an era that started with a boom and ended with a crash. In one essay Colette unpacks how hearing Ludacris' hit song What's Your Fantasy shaped the course of a generation's sexual awakening, in another she unpacks how her eating disorder developed as railthin models from the collapsed USSR flooded the pages of Vogue; in another, she explores how post-9/11 hysteria curdled into a kitschy patriotic consumerism that warps our politics to this day. Perfect for fans of Joan Didion, Jia Tolentino, and Chuck Klosterman, Y2K is a hysterical, intimate, and provocative exploration of the final days of millennial optimism. The collection is poised to be the first definitive look back at a cultural period undergoing a resurgence of popular scrutiny, from one of our sharpest and funniest contemporary essayists.





Working with a medium often criticized as exclusionary, elitist, and out-of-touch, Anna is one of very few women in the field of puzzle making, where she strives to make the everyday diversion more diverse.

In this fascinating work—part memoir, part cultural analysis—she excavates the hidden history of the crossword and the overlooked women who have been central to its creation and evolution, from the "Crossword Craze" of the 1920s to the role of digital technology today. As she tells the story of her own experience in the CrossWorld, she analyzes the roles assigned to women in American culture, the boxes they've been allowed to fill, and the ways that they've used puzzles to negotiate the constraints and play of desire under patriarchy.

The result is an unforgettable and engrossing work of art, a loving and revealing homage to one of our most treasured, entertaining, and ultimately political pastimes.


The Gender Rebels Who Changed the Face of Skateboarding

The bad*ss story of a crew of female, queer, bi, and non-binary skaters who charted a path to the Olympics and changed the face of an entire sport.

Who gets to tell the story of skateboarding? For most of its history, skateboarding has been dominated by men. It's time to set the record straight. Drop In is the first book to tell a different story about skateboarding by recognizing the female, queer, bi, and non-binary skateboarders responsible for skateboarding's emerging culture of inclusivity. But it wasn't easy getting here. In the 70s, skate personified the punk rock, lock-up-your-daughters, middle-finger-to-the-man ethos. In the 80s, it was "Miami Vice" soundtracks and parachute pants, neon graphics and fingerless gloves. In the 90s it was New York—graffiti, hip-hop, street. In all those decades, skateboarding was patriarchal and systemically sexist just like the rest of the world. Rarely did you see a woman's name in a skate video—either on a deck or behind the lens. The four skateboarders at the heart of Deb Stoll's dynamic narrative defy conventional expectations. Alana as the first openly non-binary athlete in Olympic history; Vanessa as the first trailblazing gold medalist at the X Games; Marbie as a prominent trans skater pushing boundaries today; and Victoria as a rookie turned social media sensation. Drop In vividly recounts their journeys to prominence, from rebellious outsiders to the historic stage of the 2021 Tokyo Olympics, where skateboarding made its monumental debut. Their experiences offer a new collective story about skateboarding, amplifying the voices that have long been overlooked.

Deborah Stoll is a novelist, journalist, musician, screenwriter, and animator. Her writing has appeared in the Los Angeles Times, The Economist, LA Weekly, the San Francisco Chronicle and Punch Drink. Her short stories have been published in Slake, Swivel and Fresh Yarn. Her songs have been heard on TV shows such as American Idol, Glee, CSI Miami, and Pretty Little Liars; in movies like For a Good Time, Call; and in ads for Ralph Lauren. Hell Put to Shame

By Earl Swift

From the acclaimed New York Times bestselling author of Chesapeake Requiem comes a gripping new work of narrative nonfiction telling the forgotten story of the mass killing of eleven Black farmhands on a Georgia plantation in the spring of 1921—a crime which exposed for the nation the existence of the "peonage system," a form of legal enslavement established after the Civil War across the American South.


On a Sunday morning in the spring of 1921, a small boy made a grim discovery as he played on a riverbank in the cotton country of rural Georgia: the bodies of two drowned men, bound together with wire and chain and weighted with a hundred-pound sack of rocks. Within days a third body turned up in another, nearby river, and in the weeks that followed, eight others. And with them, a deeper horror: all eleven had been kept in virtual slavery before their deaths. In fact, as America was shocked to learn, the dead were among thousands of Black men enslaved throughout the South, in conditions nearly as dire as those before the Civil War.

Hell Put to Shame tells the forgotten story of that mass killing, and of the revelations about peonage, or debt slavery, that it placed before a public self-satisfied that involuntary servitude had ended at Appomattox more than fifty years before.

By turns police procedural, courtroom drama, and political expose, *Hell Put to Shame* also reintroduces readers to three Americans who spearheaded the prosecution of John S. Williams, the wealthy plantation owner behind the murders, at a time when White people rarely faced punishment for violence against their Black neighbors. Georgia Governor Hugh M. Dorsey had earned international infamy while prosecuting the 1913 Leo Frank murder case in Atlanta and consequently won the statehouse as a hero of white supremacists—then redeemed himself in spectacular fashion with the "Murder Farm" affair. The remarkable polymath James Weldon Johnson, newly appointed the first Black leader of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, marshaled the organization into a full-on war against peonage. And Johnson's lieutenant, Walter F. White, a light-skinned, fair-haired, blue-eyed Black man, conducted undercover work at the scene of lynchings and other Jim Crow atrocities, helping to throw a light on such violence and to hasten its end.

The result is a story that remains fresh and relevant a century later, as the nation continues to wrestle with seemingly intractable challenges in matters of race and justice. And the 1921 case at its heart argues that the forces that so roil society today have been with us for generations.

Earl Swift is the author of the New York Times bestseller Chesapeake Requiem, which was named to ten best-of-the-year lists. His other books include Across the Airless Wilds, Auto Biography, The Big Roads, and Where They Lay. A former reporter for the Virginian-Pilot and a contributor to Outside and other publications, he is a fellow of Virginia Humanities at the University of Virginia. He lives in the Blue Ridge mountains west of Charlottesville.





His adventures bring him into contact with some of the most prominent American political figures, as well as on-the-take diplomats, mercenary arms dealers and compromised C.I.A. assets, not to mention brutal dictators, tarnished royals and blackmailing oligarchs who have no gualms about doling out obscene amounts of cash to get what they want from Washington. As long as the U.S. government can live with the ultimate result — or have plausible deniability — and the checks clear, everyone is willing to look the other way. This seedy intersection between K Street, official Washington and farflung international capitals is increasinally shaping world affairs. Gone are the days when overseas crises were resolved by learned career diplomats and ambassadors over tea in embassy sitting rooms. Stryk and his brethren represent an outsourcing to the highest bidder of the once careful, considered work of statecraft. And the more unsavory the character, the higher the price. An entire industry has developed of political fixers like Stryk in Washington and other Western capitals who cater to an expanding universe of these types of clients. The industry — and its effectiveness — has been building for years, mostly without the public knowing any better — until now.

Kenneth Vogel investigates the confluence of money, politics, and influence for the Washington bureau of The New York Times. He previously reported for POLITICO and is the author of Big Money: 2.5 Billion Dollars, One Suspicious Vehicle, and a Pimp—on the Trail of the Ultra-Rich Hijacking American Politics. Senior fellow at the University of Pennsylvania, Kandi Wiens, shares a guide for how to avoid burnout by developing key skills of emotional intelligence.

Why does burnout elude some people in the world's most stressful careers while it ravages the lives of millions of others in ordinary jobs? What can we learn from these resilient role models who are naturally resistant to burnout? After her own experience of burnout caused a life-threatening health crisis, Dr. Wiens left a lucrative career in management consulting and enrolled in a doctoral program at the University of Pennsylvania to understand why burnout was leaving millions of us sick, exhausted, unmotivated, and feeling stuck and ineffective. In her research she found something shocking: Despite dangerous levels of work-related stress, some workers were avoiding burnout entirely.

So what did this group of people have that millions of others did not? It turns out there was one key difference: Regardless of their role, industry, or experience, all of these leaders exhibited a high degree of emotional intelligence (EI). In a nutshell, EI is the ability to clearly perceive, understand, and productively manage emotions, thoughts, and behaviors. The workers with burnout immunity were relying on specific El skills to successfully cope with stressful work environments and experiences—and the downstream effect was to render burnout virtually nonexistent.

The good news is that everyone can build and boost their emotional intelligence and use El-based skills to successfully manage workplace stress and immunize themselves against burnout. Dr. Weins breaks down the five El skills that can protect you from Burnout into one easy-to-follow framework called ARMOR: A = Awareness; R = Regulation; M = Meaningful Connections; O = Outlook; R = Recover, Reconnect, and Reimagine. Through this framework, bolstered with research, exercises, self-assessments, and importantly, real-life stories from people with natural burnout immunity and those who've learned to cultivate it, Burnout Immunity teaches workers to avoid burnout well before it strikes, and to enjoy a healthier and happier relationship with work.

Dr. Kandi Wiens is a Senior Fellow at the University of Pennsylvania, Director of the Penn Master's in Medical Education Program and the Penn Health Professions Education Certificate Program, and Academic Director of the PennCLO Master's Program. She has frequently taught at Wharton Executive Education and in the PennCLO Executive Doctoral Program. Her areas of expertise include burnout, emotional intelligence, resiliency, and organizational change and culture. Kandi is a national speaker, executive coach, and organizational change consultant. Her coaching practice is deeply grounded in emotional intelligence, burnout, and resiliency research and methods.
